Fresh greenery and flowers will adorn our tables. Gardeners and flower arrangers are invited to bring a fresh arrangement to add to the table decor.








A “must see” final show of the season at the Treasure Island Community Center presents the work of award winning Art Guild members


With abstract realism, acrylics and India ink, Beattie, a longtime resident of Micronesia, reflects her love of “warm climates, animals, and the ocean” in unique renderings “Relaxing at Pool”



and “California Sunshine in Florida”. Her carefully created imagery treats us to a morphing “Eel Ladies” and a surprising, thought pro-

voking “Reclining Nude With Tapa”.

Working with a variety of mediums and primarily self-taught, Cushing speaks to a passion “to create the joy of life” as evidenced in her work. Oils give us a radiant sunset in “Florida Glow” and a stoically posed Egret in “Watchful”. Watercolor captures the nature of one of Florida’s’ treasures “Playful Manatees” and an explosion of hues in “Yellow Iris”.



While showcasing her talent in pastel portraits “A Kiss Brings a Smile” and



“Duke”, and in oils, spirited Clydesdales “Dashin’ Thru the Snow”, Dwyer, with patience and an unwavering control of her medium, excels in the world of miniature art. A

4 x 6 oil painting “Just Pals” is one of five fine examples that “whisper” for your attention.


Zetterberg's keen observations and curiosity as a child spilled over into his adult life as an artist. The rhythm of loose, impressive brushstrokes gives us a compelling acrylic, a biblical narrative, "Abram". Contrasting dots of color in Gouache describe an enchanting "Michelle".

A collage "Little Leaper" and in pastels, a copy of a Reuben's "Fawn Clutching Grapes", show his versatility.



Painting paperweights as a child triggered the career of world traveler and fine artist Zill, who exhibits her "love" for color with masterful applications of watercolor in still lifes

"Tango With Mango", "Tropics Inspirations II" and an abstract "Twilight". As placid Flamingos take "time out" in "Lily Pond Trio", eye-popping luminous color takes center stage.
